Harvest Helpers

May 28, June 11 & June 18, 2020

Be part of the Manitoba Agricultural Museum harvesting crew! Students will fully participate in harvest duties by loading the sheaf wagon, tossing sheaves in the thresher and learn about pioneer farm equipment. They will also visit our Homesteaders' Village to complete their immersion!
